For Dan Furkert, lockdown in late 2021 has been difficult and stressful at times, but on the upside there was a chance to spend more time with the family and get some long-standing projects finished. For some time he had been in the process of designing and building a new skin-on-frame boat that he hoped would be perfect for exploring the wild west coast rock gardens, and negotiating its powerful surf. The design took elements of well-known kayaks that surf well, along with some features from NZ longboards and traditional Alaskan rough-water kayaks. It was all put together using techniques he'd learnt building a traditional Greenland craft, with Brian Schulz at Cape Falcon Kayaks in Oregon in 2016.

The shape came together finally, just as he had <u>imagined</u> it, custom artwork by all the family \odot and so far, it has more than lived up to its planned job of surviving fun ocean whitewater, and exploring the details of the <u>west coast</u>.

Dan is now looking forward to pushing it further in new paddling spots soon, without lockdown barriers!

Will be based at Stony Bay DOC, between Port Jackson and Port Charles on the north-eastern coast of the Coromandel Peninsula, following the KASK Kayak Fest. It will be hosted by the Te Henga Caving Club (THCC)

The plan is to enjoy the remote and beautiful location, and take advantage of the chance to explore and play along the coastline, caves and stony beaches.

With the right swell there may be surf at Waikawau a short drive or half-day paddle to the south. Great Barrier is only 20 km away, so a circumnavigation or two-day return trip may be an option for those always looking to the horizon.
